You can ask the support team for help.***

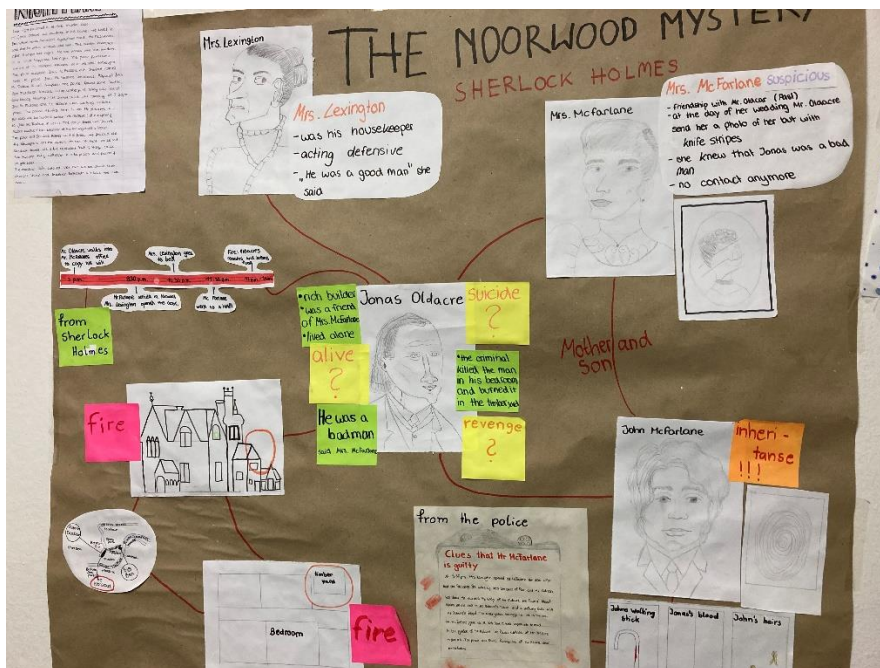


# The crime board team

- **Later on, continue reading at your own speed.**

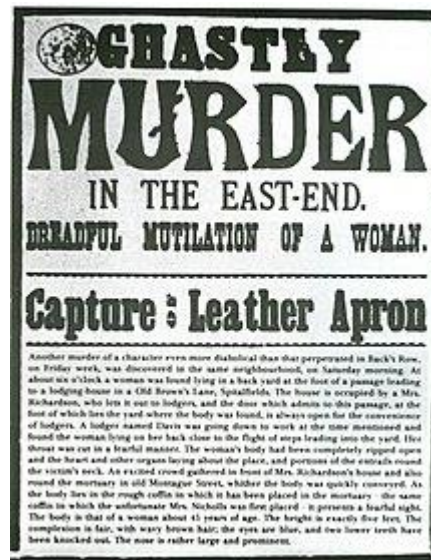
- Draw and pin up pictures of the suspects.
- Find out background information about them.
- Find out their motives.
- Search for clues for John McFarlane's guilt or innocence.

# The news team

- First, read chapters 1 – 4.
- Later on, continue reading at your own speed.
- In your team you will need
  - reporters
  - writers
  - editors.



1. **News team:** You work with the newspaper and would like to write a newspaper article about the murder case. Investigate, interview and write the article.
2. **Reporters:** Interview Sherlock Holmes and Inspector Lestrade or any sergeant. Write the questions for the interview and interview the persons, take notes of the answers. *Report back to the writers and editors.*
3. **Writers:** You write the article, ask the reporters for the information from their interviews with Mr. Holmes and the police. Make sure your text includes the correct information, is interesting and exciting.
4. **Editors:** You are responsible for the final draft of the article. Read the writers' text, check if it is interesting and engaging, also check the correct use of the language.

***The news team may interview Sherlock Holmes and inspector Lestrade, and ask the support team for help.***

# Inspector Lestrade and the police

You would like to catch Mr. Oldacre's murderer and need the help of your sergeants.

Look for clues that Mr. McFarlane is guilty and write them down in a list.
