How to

Write a **newspaper article**

- 1. Get together in your group and brainstorm:
 - what information you will include
 - where to get the information from
- 2. Structure your ideas in paragraphs.
- 3. Share paragraph writing in your group and regularly get together for feedback sessions.
- 4. Start each paragraph with a topic sentence. The following sentences should give lots of background information, details and examples.
- 5. Find a catchy heading and introduction, as well as an interesting ending that shows that the murder case has not been solved yet but you will keep your reader informed.
- 6. Write an article of about 300 words and <u>use a dictionary</u> for help.

How to

Prepare and conduct **an interview**

- 1. Get together in your group and brainstorm:
 - what topics you will ask about
 - what information you will include
 - where you will get the information from
- 2. Formulate questions using different question words, be as polite as possible.
- 3. Think of a logical order of your questions.
- 4. What else will you ask/ tell the interviewee to create a real-life conversation (do not produce a question-answer interview as this is really impolite!!!)
- 5. Write down the questions and interview the persons.
- 6. Write up the interview in about 300 words and <u>use a dictionary</u> for help.

How to

Produce a pictionary

- 1. Get together in your group and brainstorm:
 - what words and phrases you will include (*check your classmates' vocab lists*)
 - where you will get the information from
 - how you can show these words and phrases in pictures/ where you can get the pictures from
- 2. Structure your ideas and produce/ print pictures, match the pictures and the explanations.
- 3. Glue them onto a sheet of paper.
- 4. Prepare a pictionary for about 50 words. <u>Use a dictionary</u> for help.

How to

Make a crime board.

- 1. Check out the internet for different versions of crime boards and, in your group, and choose one.
- 2. Brainstorm what information, pictures, material, etc. you will need and where you can get them from.
- 3. Keep asking the other teams for their results.
- 4. Make sure your crime board is always clear and looks very structured.
- 5. <u>Use a dictionary</u> for help.

How to

Produce a **crossword puzzle**.

- 1. Get together and select the words you would like to use in your crossword puzzle.
- 2. Write short clues for the puzzle.
- 3. Group the words *across* and *down* to end up with a clear and structured puzzle. You can use black spaces as fillers to show where there will not be any letters.
- 4. You could also use an online crossword puzzle maker: https://www.education.com/worksheet-generator/reading/crossword-puzzle/
- 5. Put the answers to the puzzle on a separate sheet of paper.
- 6. <u>Use a dictionary</u> for help.
